Overview

McHenry Community High School is a comprehensive high school system located 55 miles northwest of metropolitan Chicago. The school district is comprised of two four-year high schools, East Campus and West Campus, which offer similar programs and curricula. Both schools are fully accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Scheduling

District 156 has a traditional schedule with eight, 45-minute periods each day and a 35-minute support period four days of the week. All one-credit courses meet one period daily; two-credit courses meet two periods daily.

McHenry Community High School partners with McHenry County College in offering 10 courses that students can take at MCC or at MCHS.

Advanced Placement and Honors
